We pray for Christian camps and holiday clubs and missions, seeking to bring the good news of your love to our young people. We thank you for your W ord that has been preached down the centuries. We thank you for its truth. May it be read afresh by young and old this week and may your goodness speak clearly from its pages.

We think of our communities: we pray for our shopkeepers, office workers, healthcare professionals, cleaners and drivers. Those who work long hours... may they find time to rest in you ...

We pray for our leaders when government is on recess. May they still be alert to any needs that require attention. We pray that there will not be any unrest in regard to those seeking asylum.
