We ask that they would have the wisdom and grace to use words that bring unity rather than division, and words of love and care for others rather than of selfishness and unnecessary fear. We pray for words of honesty and truth to be at the centre of reporting, and that all would be free to live in peace and safety. God of justice, we hand this to you as we are powerless, and we know you bring grace and fairness.

God of freedom, we pray for those who feel chained by things of the world. We think of those in our own community who have no money despite hard work and dedication, and feel the never-ending sense of the burden of debt and desperation of never having enough. We pray for those chained by addiction to drink or drugs, whose lives seem to be going nowhere and who do desperate and cruel things to feed their addiction. We pray for those who suffer quietly, with little support and few friends, and live lives of isolation and sadness far from your plan for your people. We pray for those who have run out of hope, and think about the value of their own lives. God of freedom, we hand this to you as we are powerless, and we know you bring freedom.

God brings freedom, hope and peace.

God's word is not chained.

God of hope, you have called us to be part of your community here, and to bring hope into the lives of others. We think of those who serve us in our church, including the leaders who teach and lead us in worship, the practical people who make things happen and do the unseen work, and all the people who serve quietly without anyone really noticing. We pray for those who serve us in our schools, colleges, shops, surgeries and all other places that build this area. We ask that you would show each of us and us as a fellowship of believers what we can do to bring your light and hope to others. God of hope, on our own we are powerless, but with you we know we can be people of hope.

Work in King Edmund and Greensward were also talked about, with a consultation one possible way to determine what would work best with the young people.

I also attended the launch of the Megacentre Community Hub, based in Rayleigh Methodist Church. I had the chance to meet a local youth worker and to talk about outreach ideas as well as to catch up with the Megacentre CEO. I also spoke with members of the Revive community supermarket team and advised them on some external funding.

Next week I will be starting the first part of a three-part residential training course in Coventry, looking at community leadership. The first section is on understanding your own leadership style and to improve your leadership capabilities. Although led by the Local Government Association, I am sure that I will learn a lot applicable to this role as well. I am also hoping to visit the Christian Resources Exhibition.
